Commentary

The edges of the wax cylinder in Figures 1 and 3 are also clearly visible in the bright field due to strong light refraction. The size and the notches make the cylinder in Figure 1 more typical and it should not be confused with a granular cylinder because of the few stipples. Figure 2 was a hyaline cylinder that is almost invisible in the bright field. The small dark stipples are deposited dirt particles.
